Wairua – Diversity <i>Eg neurodiversity, accessibility, wairuatanga, holistic wellbeing</i>	Whānau - Special Interest Groups <i>Eg Te Pūkenga, MATHLAANZ, Science, Whakabou – recovering from work chaos</i>

Presenters can choose which category best suits their presentation or discussion. ATLAANZ members are free!
